1) Those distributions that do what you need done.

2) Those distributions that work well on your machine.

3) Those distributions that your friend uses.

Who else can best help you?

S/he can gently tell you when you are asking the wrong questions.

4) Those distributions that strive to keep you FREE.

As in FREE speech, not free beer.

Think about the Liberty Bell, and the Bill of Rights.

Any that won't lock you into something you don't yet see.

5) Those distributions that are somewhat popular; but, not necessarily in the top five.

You may have to look at more than just a few.

Look at the top 20, not just the top 5.

Popularity is hard to determine, fleeting and usually biased.

6) Those distributions that are available as a Live Linux CDROM disc format.

Runs within RAM, allowing you to try before writing anything to your hard drive.
